Section 2: About You & Your Practice

Short Bio:

Examples could be: If you have studied art and what you studied, or exhibitions, performances, or art events you have taken part in, organised or curated. Please keep in mind what you are proposing to do for the residency; it would be good to talk about aspects of your experience, or achievements that are relevant to your proposed idea. This will allow the panel to assess your potential and ability to realise the proposed work in the gallery.

Section 3: The Artwork

Please note to ensure the award is suitable you should be able to complete any works still in progress during the 10-12 weeks after decisions have been made.

Section 5: Award Impact

Section 6: Documentation of Artwork

This section is especially important. For works that are complete it allows the panel to fully understand your proposal and imagine it in the gallery. For works to be completed try to choose examples that are relevant to your proposal. Think about how the examples could demonstrate the ambition, themes, or skills required in your proposal.

You may also include exhibition mock ups or non-art related examples which provide evidence of the skills and experience necessary for your proposal.

Please note here is a max file size of 10MB per file. If you are submitting large audio or video files it may be easier for you to upload to YouTube, Vimeo, or SoundCloud and share the link. If your work is documented online, please feel free to provide website links only.
